The Earth Rangers School Assembly is a curriculum-linked environmental education program for elementary students that inspires learning and taking action.

Led by two enthusiastic presenters, students were transported to habitats around the world to learn about **biodiversity**, and the incredible adaptations animals use to survive in the wild.

Throughout the program our presenters introduced our special **Animal Ambassadors**; and highlighted the unique characteristics and behaviours that help them to thrive in their environment.

This fall, we also introduced a new "member" of the presenter team: **ECO**, the hologram! In this brand new experience, ECO speaks to the audience and our presenter, drawing from her encyclopaedic animal knowledge.



The School Assembly featured a dynamic multimedia setup that transformed the school's gymnasium. Students participated in the experience by engaging in friendly competition with their peers as either 'Team Goose' or 'Team Moose', testing their animal knowledge in trivia games. They also learned all about how they can take action themselves.



Empowering

Our program highlighted the initiatives of real-world conservationists, like Megan Quinn from the Nature Conservancy of Canada, working in Ontario to protect vital wildlife habitat by removing invasive species.



As Earth Rangers members, children gain access to a suite of educational and engaging content, and hands-on activities that have a real-world impact in their communities. Missions that children and their families can undertake together include planting a pollinator garden, conducting a shoreline cleanup, or conducting a home energy audit to shrink their carbon footprint. These all contribute to not only a positive environmental impact, but imparting values of confidence, leadership, and stewardship in children.

Following the program deliveries in the area, over 5,321 children in Alberta and B.C. have joined Earth Rangers – all of whom are ready to learn and take positive action in their schools, homes, and communities!
